

Rosa 'Compassion'



- Tall climber (15'+); peachy-pink; multi-petaled
- Blooms all summer, long-stemmed roses
- Strong fragrance
- From England, 1972, Peter Harkness

Rosa 'Orfeo'



- Climber (7'); intensely fragrant deep crimson flowers borne in clusters
- Reblooms through the summer, excellent for cutting
- Created in 1963 by J, Leenders, from Holland

Rosa 'Zeus'



- Moderate climber (7'); yellow, multi-petaled
- Blooms all summer, moderate fragrance
- From Ohio, 1959, Kern Nursery

Rosa 'America'



- Vigorous rambler; small pink flowers borne in clusters
- The flowers are small with five petals
- Blooms in June to early July
- There is some rebloom during the summer
- Created in 1915, Woods Hole, MA by M.H. Walsh
- Not to be confused with the modern climber of the same name

Rosa 'du Roi'



- Shrubby (4') old garden rose with fragrant crimson roses
- From the gardens of King Louis XVIII, first grown in 1812
- One of the earliest Portland roses

Rosa 'Onex'



- Shrubby (3'), violet blooms, many petals
- Blooms in early summer; light fragrance
- A gallica rose of origin, from Europe.
- Possibly created in the gardens of Empress Josephine

Rosa micrugosa alba



- Shrubby hybrid of *R. rugosa* and *R. roxburghii* (8')
- Large five petaled blooms, light fragrance
- White with blush of pink, appears to be hand painted

Rosa 'Mme. Legras de St. Germain'



- Shrubby, lax habit (4'); pure white, multi-petaled
- Can be trained as a pillar rose or pegged
- Blooms in early summer, very fragrant
- An alba rose from Paris, 1846

Rosa 'Stanwell Perpetual'



- Shrubby, lax habit (3'); blush white, many petals
- Blooms all summer, very fragrant
- Can be pegged
- A spinosissima rose from England, 1838

Rosa mutabilis



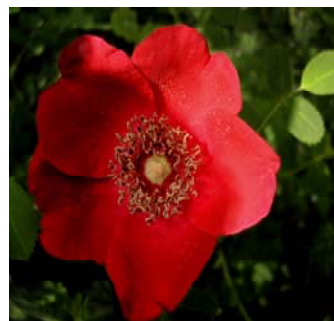
- Shrubby, tall (4 – 7'); five petals, multi-colored
- Blooms all summer; small rose hips
- Very old China rose, thought to be from Italy, via China
- Pre-19th century

Rosa virginiana



- Shrubby (3'); pink flowers, single blooms
- Blooms in late spring, red hips for summer/winter
- A North American native, first recorded in 1807

Rosa moyesii 'Geranium'



- Shrubby, tall (6'); true red flowers, five petals
- Blooms in early summer; beautiful bottle shaped hips (scarlet)
- A species hybrid, introduced to commerce in 1938, England
