## Plant Care Tips for January

During the bleak winter months, the extreme cold temperatures can take its toll on all of your trees. The main task is to protect them from the very cold weather. Check the soil in the pots to make sure it has not dried out. If so, water the soil so it is just damp. Don't wait until spring to do all of your maintenance! Winter is an excellent time for heavy pruning, new design and carving, needle plucking on pines (2-3 yr old needles). Don't forget to take off old wire and add new wire. This is a good time to plan your repotting schedule for spring. Draw up a list of trees that need repotting and order your soil requirements and any pots you may need. Finally, watch out for mice girdling your trees. Use mothballs or a hungry cat to prevent problems! [DY]

In recent years, with our increasingly mild winters, I have abandoned the covered cold frame for all of my hardy outdoor trees, largely in response to a nasty rodent event that hit my collection a few winters back. Outdoor temperatures were in the upper 20s and lower 30s, but inside the cold frame the soil was thawed and voles found the environment absolutely delightful—they dug burrows through all my larger pots, stripped all the live tissue from a dozen bonsai, and gnawed the roots clean off several bonsai apples and baldcypress. I lost about a third of a very large collection that year. The trees too big for the cold frame, and which I left exposed to be frozen solid, were untouched by the rodents. Since then I have restricted my collection to those species that can take whatever Mother Nature dishes out. The key, then, is to make sure the soil does not completely desiccate during prolonged cold spells. [JM]
