March Meeting: Tree Selection for MABS / Repotting Workshop

This month's meeting will be focused on selecting the 4 trees to represent GSBS at this year's Mid-Atlantic Bonsai Societies' (MABS) Spring Festival, so please bring along your finest bonsai to help show our stuff. Voting will be by "penny vote," where each member gets four pennies to place before the trees they like the best. A runner-up will also be selected in case circumstances prevent one of the trees from performing its duties at the festival. Please consider entering a tree to represent our club – the broader the selection, the more choices we have, and the better to show what we are accomplishing at GSBS.

We will also, depending on conditions, hold a workshop on **root pruning and repotting**, so bring your trees and tools, and plan to get a workout. Another great hands-on exercise for newcomers and experienced artists alike.

Mid Atlantic (MABS) Spring Festival – April 25–27, 2014

Please plan on attending this year's Mid Atlantic Bonsai Societies (MABS) Spring Festival, held this year at the **Ramada Inn** on **Route 10 West** in **East Hanover, NJ**. It's only minutes from our usual meeting place in Morristown, an easy drive from all major highways.

The fun starts Friday afternoon with three concurrent **hands-on workshops** (check for availability), with guest artists **Suthin Sukosolvisit**, **Corin Tomlinson**, or **Takashi lura**. The vendor area opens between 4-6 pm, offering pots, tools, wire, soil, trees, accent plants, DVDs, and you name it. At 8:00 pm there will be a lecture/demo by **Suthin**. Saturday starts with the vendor area opening at 8:00 am and more lecture/demos by all three guests throughout the day. Professional **critiques** of the trees on display will be held at 5:30 and 6:45 pm. The **club members' exhibit** will be open all day as well. A **banquet and auction** starts at 8:00 pm.

Fees apply to all workshops, lecture/demos, and critiques, and availability is limited. Go to <u>http://midatlanticbonsai.freeservers.com/fescurr.htm</u> for details.

The vendor and display areas open again at 8:00 am Sunday, with final lecture/demos by all three artists going till noon, at which time everybody packs up and heads for home.

General admission to the bonsai display and vendor areas is \$20.00 and well worth it. For all other activities you may register in person or online (I suggest online, and ASAP). Please register as a member of the GSBS – our club receives a portion of the cash surplus in proportion to our participation in the workshops and lectures.

Last Month's Meeting: Forest Planting Workshop

Another good turnout, as club members focused on arranging, root-pruning, and repotting three large **forest plantings** (Korean Hornbeam and Zelkova, both owned by club member Fred Aufschlager, and Trident Maple, owned by club member Ismail Gurler). It was another great opportunity for newcomers to get some hands-on experience, and work with an unusual type of bonsai planting.

Plant Care Tips for March

Have I been saying that snow is good? Well, we've had snow up to our eyeballs for most of the winter, and hopefully it has helped insulate your outdoor bonsai against the terrific cold. (I'm still waiting for it to melt enough so that I can <u>see</u> my trees! And praying that the rodents have not been nibbling at the bark under the cover of their snowy blanket.)

March is the perfect time to repot, and to branch- and root-prune. Trees less than 5 years old should be repotted annually [opinions differ widely on this--JM], trees between 5 and 20 years old may be repotted every other year, and trees over 20 should be repotted every 3 years. By the end of March, depending on weather conditions, trees can be gradually brought out of winter shelter. Evergreens may be fertilized now and, in general, you may spray for fungus and insects on a warm day. March is a good time to lift deciduous trees from the ground, as buds have not yet broken. Evergreens can be lifted until the end of April. March and April are also good months to dig trees from the wild, keeping as much fibrous root attached as possible. [DY]

Keep your trees cool. Don't be in a hurry to encourage early growth, as it can still get cold. March is a *great* month for repotting, and for digging planted trees and collecting field grown ones. [JM]
