May Highlights

During the May meeting, we discussed some minor things about displaying your trees on shows. Michael Markoff gave us some information acquired during his critiques at MABS, on the proper way to display your trees when using accent items. Following on the etiquette used in Japanese bonsai show displays, based on this we just learned that your bonsai tree has to be pointing toward your accent item and/ or scroll, and that your pot has to be centered in the table. Also, that you should never place your tree directly on the displaying table, talking about the table where you put you composition on, without a table, a slab or a bamboo mat of some sort. You should also keep in mind that the pot of your accent plant or the item used as your accent should never call your attention away from your tree, your bonsai should be the center of attention in your display.

Plant Care Tips for June

It's getting late to dig or repot hardy trees, though it can still be done if you know what you're doing or have a smart friend. Your feeding, pinching, and pruning schedules should be in full swing by now. Pinch the terminal buds from deciduous trees, leaving only one pair of leaves, and most of your candle-pinching for evergreens will be winding down at this point. Everyone seems to have their own preferences for fertilizers and feeding schedules, so ask around or find a good book. Keep an eye peeled for insect pests and don't overdo it with the chemicals! Always read and follow manufacturers' directions, and be aware that plants in small containers are more easily stressed than plants growing in the ground. If you spray your trees with insecticides or fungicides, it's best to put them into the shade for the rest of the day.

Hello everyone,

On our May meeting, we discussed the final arrangements that needed to be taken care for our June Open House. Including the proper way of displaying your trees, that is placement of the tree on top of a displaying table, wood slab, etc... the tree has to point at the accent plant, stone or figuring. If you feel that you need more instruction on proper displaying etiquette you can contact any of the Clubs board members, and ask for help on this matter.

Annual Open House, to be held

in the upstairs hall of the Haggerty Education Center (the same building in which we have our meetings) on Sunday June 5th, between 10:00 am and 3:00 pm. ALL CLUB MEMBERS are encouraged to bring one or a few trees to display to the public. We will have a large display of club trees, and present several lecture/demos with the demo trees raffled to the public. Club members should arrive by 9:00 am on the show day, to help set up. We will supply tables, risers, and table runners. Please make sure to bring along a suitable stand, base, rock slab, board, bamboo mat, etc. to set beneath your tree(s) for an outstanding presentation, as well as suitable accent plants. If you don't have such items, email a club member and perhaps we can help you put something together. Also useful are those tri-fold cardboard presentation boards (you can find them in office supply stores, arts & crafts store, etc...) that stand about 3 foot high and cost between \$4-15 depending on quality and they come in both black and white, depending on what sort of backdrop you prefer. (These aren't mandatory, but they come in useful if you need to display your tree in front of, for example, the auditorium's fire alarm, extinguisher or any window)

Also coming up is our Annual Club Picnic, Which will be held at Michael and May Markoff's home, on Sunday, August 7, starting around 12 noon.
