SUNDAY, JUNE 7th - GSBS Annual Bonsai OPEN HOUSE

The first Sunday of June is our club's **annual Open House**. Please bring a tree, or two or three, to display in the large lecture hall upstairs of our usual meeting room at the **Frelinghuysen Arboretum**. Open to the public from **10:00 am to 4:00 pm**, but **club members please arrive by 9:00 am to help set up**. Bring trees, accent plants, stands, etc. if you have them. Some tips for displaying your trees are provided on the next page.

We will be presenting a variety of lecture-demos aimed at beginners, but will field questions of any sort from all comers. Please consider bringing a tree to actually work on during the show we've found that people love to walk up and ask you questions about what you're doing!

Some of the demo trees will be raffled, and visitors will cast their votes for people's choice.

There will also be **pots, soil, tools, DVDs, magazines, books, and tools for sale**, so bring some cash or your checkbook in case there's something you like.

Some tips for displaying your bonsai

Classically, bonsai are **displayed on a stand**, **flat stone**, **or mat** of some kind, to set the tree apart from its background. Apart from purpose-crafted wood bonsai tables and stands, a pleasing affect can be achieved using rustic slabs of stone, bamboo place settings, artfully-arranged weathered boards, etc. With a bit of imagination, a great variety of inexpensive materials can be put to pleasing affect, so do give it some thought.





In addition, there is usually **an accent plant, stone, or sculpture placed to one side**, to enhance the sense of space around the bonsai. Again, a great variety of things can be used with a little imagination.



Finally, you may consider bringing a self-standing backdrop of some kind, to provide cover in case your tree is placed near distractions in our display hall



(windows, light switch panels, fire extinguishers, etc.) that you

would rather hide from view during the show. We have found that **tri-fold display boards** (used for displays at meetings or trade shows) made of white or black cardboard, or foam-core board, work fairly well for all but the largest bonsai displays. They can be purchased at office supply and craft stores.

Beginners: please feel welcome to bring your "beginner bonsai" for display! It's a great opportunity for newcomers to see where it all starts.

Novices and non-members always welcome! Come and plan to get your hands dirty!

Plant Care Tips for June

It's getting late to dig or repot hardy trees, though it can still be done if you know what you're doing or have a smart friend. Your feeding, pinching, and pruning schedules should be in full swing by now. Pinch the terminal buds from deciduous trees, leaving only one pair of leaves, and most of your candle-pinching for evergreens will be winding down at this point. Everyone seems to have their own preferences for fertilizers and feeding schedules, so ask around or find a good book. Keep an eye peeled for insect pests and don't overdo it with the chemicals! Always read and follow manufacturers' directions, and be aware that plants in small containers are more easily stressed than plants growing in the ground. If you spray your trees with insecticides or fungicides, it's best to put them into the shade for the rest of the day. [JM]

Fred still has Akadama soil, in two granule sizes—2.5 mm (small grade) and 5.0 mm (medium grade). Bags are 18 liters, about 22 lbs. Cost per bag is \$40.00, which is a good price.
