As summer starts, and the high temperatures keep getting higher, remember to protect all those trees that usually grow in shaded zones. Also don't forget to check them in the afternoons as the heat might dry them during the day, you might need to water them again.

Plant Care Tips for July and August

It's maintenance time—keep an eye on your trees' watering needs and feed them well. Most deciduous trees have hardened up their first leaves by now and have moved into their second growth burst, with the exception of beeches which typically have only one shot per year.

There's not much to do apart from watching out for insect pests, viruses, and wilt from the summer heat. If you spray for insects or fungus, keep the tree out of full sun for a few days. If you attempted air-layering in spring this is the time to begin checking for good roots and potting those layers up (if they're ready). Don't count on the clouds to water your trees if you go away for a few days—better to set up a timed sprinkler system, bribe a reliable friend, or if nothing else, water well and place the trees in deep shade until you get back. Check your wiring to make sure the wires are not cutting into the bark; remove or loosen wires if necessary. Cut back on fertilizing by mid-August to prevent unwanted budding before the coming fall freeze.
