**The Spotted Lanternfly (*Lycorma delicatula*), originating in Asia, has reached the US and in particular, our neighbor, Pennsylvania.**

- Currently 13 counties in PA are under quarantine
- The USDA has approved over \$17 million in emergency funds to battle the Spotted Lanternfly in PA. NJ is quite likely to be the next state hit with this invasive and destructive pest. Dr. Neil Hendrickson, Northeast Technical Researcher at Bartlett Tree Experts, works out of the Bartlett Tree Research Lab in Lebanon NJ.
