Congressman Rodney Frelinghuysen made time in his busy schedule to join the Friends of The Frelinghuysen Arboretum at their annual New Year's party on January 15, 2017. Lesley Parness was

honored on her upcoming retirement as Superintendent of Horticultural Education for the Morris County Park System, having served 15 years in that position. Congressman Frelinghuysen, addressing the crowd of 150 members, praised the Friends for the many contributions they have made to the Frelinghuysen Arboretum, working in partnership with the Morris County Park Commission. He credited that collaborative effort, under the guidance of Superintendent Parness, with bringing world-class programs to the Frelinghuysen Arboretum, along with increased public appreciation of the beauty of the Arboretum. He presented Ms. Parness with a citation and a flag flown in her name over the U.S. Capitol Building.

Following Congressman Frelinghuysen's remarks, Chatham resident and author Marta McDowell gave a presentation on her new book. "All the President's Gardens." which was a New York Times best-seller. Ms. McDowell thanked Congressman Frelinghuysen and his office for arranging for her visit to the White House gardens and meeting with the head gardener.

Her book, *American Home Landscapes*, is a comprehensive, fully illustrated guide to recreating nearly 400 years of historical landscape design and adapting them to modern needs. ### Arbor Day Tree Planting Celebration

### Bead Weaving Workshop: Apple Blossom Necklace

### Ages 16 and up

Janet Palumbo and Reem Iversen have been teaching bead weaving for many years with a devoted following, rave reviews and international recognition.



Using the tools and materials provided, workshop participants will complete this beautiful necklace, while learning the basics of bead weaving. This is one of Janet's original designs based on 5-petal apple blossoms, as a way to celebrate Spring at the arboretum. The necklace uses 25 Swarovski crystal pearls, in addition to seed beads, to form the blossoms; seed bead leaves decorate the sides. Topics will include: tools, materials, and resources; bead colors and finishes; understanding beading patterns and terminology; and making creative decisions. Class is suitable for beginner and intermediate beaders.
