Ms. Byers joined the New Jersey Conservation Foundation in 1982, as coordinator of Pine Barrens projects. She became Assistant Director in 1988 and helped found the Pinelands Preservation Alliance, Whitesbog Preservation Trust, Hunterdon Land Trust and New Jersey Highlands Coalition. In 1999, Michele became Executive Director of New Jersey Conservation Foundation; she is currently advisor to the Hunterdon Land Trust and President of RethinkEnergyNJ. Recently, Michele Byers was chosen by the Garden Club of America as the recipient of the 2022 Frances K. Hutchinson Medal, awarded for distinguished service to conservation, in recognition of her decades of work to conserve natural lands. She has a BA in Biology from Western State College, Gunnison, Colorado. Recently retired from the New Jersey Conservation Foundation, Michele lives in Pottersville and is an active dressage rider, avid hiker and sheep dog trainer.

unmistakably clear. Vincent Simeone has worked in the horticultural field for over 30 years. He received an AAS degree in ornamental horticulture from SUNY Farmingdale, and a BS in ornamental horticulture from the University of Georgia. While at Georgia, Vincent studied under well-known professors Dr. Michael Dirr and Dr. Allan Armitage. For the past 23 years, Vincent has worked in public horticulture at Planting Fields Arboretum State Historic Park in Oyster Bay, New York, where he is the Director. He teaches horticulture classes at the New York Botanical Garden and has appeared on several gardening programs including Martha Stewart Living and HGTV. Since 2005 he has published six books and in 2010, he contributed to a first ever textbook on public garden management.

### This is Spring in a bowl!

### Fresh Pea and Lettuce Soup with **Butter Dumplings**

### Soup:

- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 1 head Boston lettuce, coarsely chopped
- 4 cups fresh peas
- 1 ½ quarts chicken stock or vegetable stock
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 cup cream
- 1/4 cup chopped Italian parsley

In a large soup pot, saute the onions in the butter until translucent. Add the lettuce and cook until wilted. Add the stock, the peas, salt and sugar and simmer for about 30 minutes. Puree the soup using an immersion blender or if using a regular blender, take care to hold the top down with a kitchen towel. Add the cream and season with salt and pepper.



### **Butter Dumplings:**

6 tablespoons soft unsalted butter 2 eggs 1 ½ cups flour 1/3 cup milk 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg 1/8 teaspoon cayenne

Cream the butter until light and fluffy and then add the eggs. Add the spices to the flour and stir to combine. Alternately, add the flour and milk, beginning and ending with the flour. The mixture should be smooth and creamy.

With oiled hands, form the dumplings into balls about the size of a teaspoon. Set aside on an oiled or parchment lined baking sheet.

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil and drop in the dumplings. Boil, covered for 15 minutes. Transfer them to the soup and enjoy!

### Ann A. Abrams

We are very sad to report that Ann Abrams, the longtime Secretary of the Friends, passed away from a short illness on November 27, 2021, at the age of 80. While working for the Friends, Ann managed the registrations for all our programs, she handled membership not just for individuals but also for our organizational and affiliate members. Ann was responsible for so many aspects of our organization that her impact is still felt to this day and we miss her.

Ann worked as a legal secretary for the Morris County Sheriff's Department until starting a family in 1970. After her children were older, she returned to work as the Secretary for the Friends of the Frelinghuysen Arboretum until she retired in 2012. Ann was a member of the Denville Sr. Citizens. She also delivered Meals on Wheels, helped with the Denville food drive, and worked at the St. Francis Garage sales. She crocheted prayer shawls with the Threads of Love Ministry at St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church. She loved gardening, knitting, crafting and playing bridge, but most of all she loved her husband who preceded her in death in September of 2021.





### *Cynthia Robinson Friends President 1992-1996*

Long-time members of the Friends will remember Cynthia Robinson, who was President of the Friends Board from 1992-1996. Cynthia passed away peacefully on January 9, 2022 at 91 years of age. She was influential in Morris County environmental and preservation efforts. Cynthia's love of nature, horticulture, and the environment began at an early age with visits to her grandfather's farm in Pennsylvania. She was a convivial person who firmly believed in citizen involvement in the community. She was active in saving the Great Swamp from becoming a jetport, and was the driving force behind preserving the historic Tunis-Ellicks House in New Vernon. For 60 years she was a member of the Garden Club of Morristown, among many other groups. She was involved in numerous horticultural projects, including helping to recreate the Tempe Wick garden at Jockey Hollow National Park, establishing a flower-arranging business called Robin Hill Flowers, and studying botanical illustration. A memorial service will take place on May 14 at 11 a.m. at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Morristown.
